SCHEDULING CONFERENCE ORDER

The case concerns a petition filed with the Vermont Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) by the Vermont Public Power Supply Authority (“VPPSA”) for approval of a proposed Electric Vehicle/ Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment (“EV/EVSE”) tariff rider program for its member utilities.

On December 5, 2023, I held a scheduling conference in this matter. Appearances were entered by Erin C. Brennan, Esq., Vermont Department of Public Service (“Department”), and William F. Ellis, Esq., McNeil, Leddy & Sheahan, on behalf of VPPSA.

The parties filed a proposed procedural schedule which is adopted with one adjustment to the due date for the first round of discovery. The schedule is as follows:

| Date | Event |

| January 11, 2024 | Workshop at 9:30 A.M. |
| January 16, 2024 | Department serves first round of discovery on VPPSA |
| January 31, 2024 | VPPSA responses to Department’s first round of discovery due |
| February 7, 2024 | Department serves second round of discovery on VPPSA |
| February 21, 2024 | VPPSA responses to Department’s second round of discovery due |
| March 13, 2024 | Deadline for stipulations, status update, or schedule for further process |

If motions for summary judgment are filed in this case, then, consistent with Commission Rule 2.219(B) and unless different deadlines are established by the Commission, (1) responses are due 30 days after the motion is filed; and (2) replies to any responses are due 14 days after the responses are filed. If motions to dismiss are filed in this case, then, consistent with Commission Rule 2.206(E), (1) responses are due 30 days after the motion is filed; and (2) replies to any responses are due 14 days after the responses are filed.¹ For any other motions, then, consistent with Commission Rule 2.206(E) and unless different deadlines are established by the Commission, (1) responses are due 14 days after the motion is filed; and (2) replies to any responses are due 14 days after the responses are filed. Consistent with Commission Rule 2.206(F), surreplies may only be filed with permission from the Commission.

Parties are reminded that documents submitted in pdf format should be in an “unlocked” format, i.e., searchable and extractable, rather than in an image format.



Members of the public may also simply monitor the Commission’s actions in a specific case.
