

Parties are *strongly* encouraged to treat discovery as rolling discovery, and file interrogatories and responses in advance of the deadlines to the greatest extent possible. I am well aware of the difficulties that this condensed schedule imposes, but I do not anticipate that, for this module, discovery will be voluminous or overly burdensome.²

The workshop will be dedicated largely to issues associated with development of the total service long-run incremental cost studies. I anticipate that a portion of this first meeting will be used to establish a framework for future workshops. This meeting will also be used to provide the Board and the parties with a better understanding of the breadth and magnitude of differences on issues that may potentially be resolved through informal workshops. I also encourage the parties to propose agendas or topics for discussion for that first workshop; these should be filed at least two days before the workshop. The workshop is scheduled to take place on Thursday, June 15, 1995, from 10:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M., at the Public Service Board Hearing Room, Third Floor, Chittenden Bank Building, 112 State Street, Montpelier, Vermont.
