ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO INTERVENE

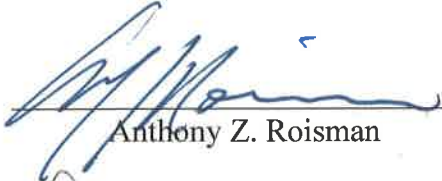
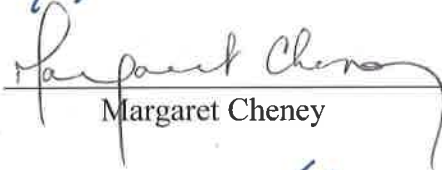
On June 27, 2018, Renewable Energy Vermont (“REV”) filed a motion to intervene in this proceeding. REV states that it is a non-profit trade organization whose membership includes businesses, non-profits, and utility customers committed to reducing reliance on fossil fuels by increasing clean renewable energy and energy efficiency in Vermont. REV asserts that Green Mountain Power Corporation (“GMP”) has identified net-metering as a driver for its rate request. Therefore, REV contends that it “has a substantial interest in ensuring that current and future GMP customers, as well as current and future REV member customers and local businesses, and progress toward the State total renewable energy and greenhouse gas pollution reduction commitments are not adversely impacted by proposals, positions or actions taken in this docket.” REV also states that its interests are not adequately protected by other parties to this proceeding and that its participation will not unduly delay the proceeding or prejudice the interests of existing parties or of the public.

On June 29, 2018, GMP responded that it did not object to REV’s participation in this proceeding.

Based upon our review of REV’s motion and GMP’s response, the Vermont Public Utility Commission grants REV’s motion to intervene pursuant to Commission Rule 2.209(B).

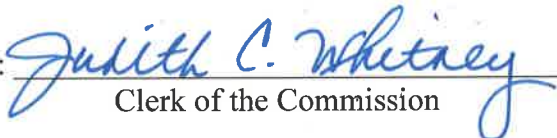
