Good to talk to you earlier today. As discussed, I have long represented the APC Paper Company, Inc. ("**APC**") in connection with its former fiber clay (the waste-paper sludge by-product of producing recycled paper) landfill located off of River Road South in Putney, Vermont. The landfill property and a smaller parcel formerly known as the blood farm (collectively, the "**Green Acres Landfill Property**") , is owned by Green Acres of Vermont, Inc. ("**GAV**"), formerly known as Putney Paper Company, Inc. ("**PPC**"), and consists of approximately 22.1 – 23.2 acres (there appears to be a minor discrepancy between the Putney Listers Card and the Putney Tax Maps).

GAV is an affiliate of APC, and only owns the Green Acres Landfill Property. I have attached a GIS map showing the Green Acres Landfill Property and former Blood Farm parcel shaded in light green; as well as the Town of Putney Listers Card with additional location maps annotated by my client. There are also extensive site plans, topographical plans, etc. of which I am in the process of requesting copies from DRM and APC's engineers.

For reasons unrelated to the Green Acres Landfill Property itself, APC would like to divest the Property and ultimately dissolve Green Acres of Vermont, Inc. APC has asked that I be the lead contact on this matter for now, and my contact information is provided below.
