**Re: Case No. 21-5254-TF – Extension of Bring Your Own Device Program and Energy Storage System Service Tariffs**

Dear Ms. Anderson:

I am writing to provide the Commission a status update on Green Mountain Power's (GMP) proposed changes to the Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Tariff to address comments from Renewable Energy Vermont (REV), which sought an alternative that would allow solar-only charging for storage devices as required for utilizing the solar Investment Tax Credit. As noted during the scheduling conference in this matter, GMP supports this alternative for participants if the value of systems that are not able to charge from the grid can be properly reflected to continue benefitting all customers. After further discussions with REV, we believe the best approach to implement this option is to add a separate BYOD tariff to provide for solar-only charging, to complement the tariff as filed in this proceeding which is specific to grid-enabled systems, with appropriate incentives that recognize the different features of each tariff.

GMP has shared a draft BYOD-Solar Charging tariff with REV and the Department of Public Service for their review. REV has requested until March 25, 2022, to review and provide any further comments to GMP, and we have shared that schedule request with DPS. As a result, we propose to file the new tariff with the Commission no later than March 29, 2022.
