Tariff filing of City of Burlington Electric Department to revise its net- metering tariff effective October 1, 2022	
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**DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SERVICE RESPONSE TO RENEWABLE
ENERGY VERMONT'S MOTION TO INTERVENE**

On September 2, 2022, the City of Burlington Electric Department ("BED") filed proposed revisions to its net-metering tariff with the Vermont Public Utility Commission ("Commission"). BED's proposed effective date is October 1, 2022, and the revised tariff predominantly reverts BED's net-metering 1.1 solar incentive (i.e. for preexisting systems) to its value before Case No. 21-2186-TF.

On September 29, 2022, Renewable Energy Vermont ("REV") moved for permissive intervention in this case under Rule 2.209. REV asserts that, as a non-profit trade organization promoting renewable energy and energy efficiency, it has a unique perspective and interest in these proceedings. REV focused on issues of notice and BED's proposal to remove payments for net-metering credits and an exception to net-metering credits expiring after 12 months. On September 30, 2022, the Vermont Public Utility Commission approved BED's tariff excepting the language highlighted by REV, issues of notice, and BED's proposed customer refund. The Vermont Department of Public Service ("Department") has no objection to REV's motion to intervene.
