To the Public Utility Commission:

I oppose this recommendation to drop the value of the solar adder once again. We were grateful to be able to install solar panels a year ago as our contribution to cleaner energy because our early 1800's house is heated with oil and a heat pump isn't feasible. Increasing the cost of solar energy is diametrically opposed to Vermont's goal of reducing fossil fuel dependence. And the development of large scale solar installations needs to be supported to enable statewide public transportation to transition to electric.

We appreciate the need to fund electric power infrastructure as we have frequent power failure, but this is not the answer. I urge you to remove the negative solar adder by adding a penny to the program, not removing it as recommended. Give everyday Vermonters a chance to own their own power generation and keep their energy dollars local.
