Hello,

The matter you are referring to is an advance submission matter: #24-1439-AN-- **60-day advance submission** of Bell Atlantic Mobile Systems of Allentown, Inc. and Cellco Partnership and Vertex Towers LLC, pursuant to 30 V.S.A. § 248a(e), proposing to request a certificate of public good authorizing the installation of wireless telecommunications equipment at 410 Hunter Park Road in Manchester, Vermont.

Advance submission means:

“Advance Submission – any requirement for an **applicant to notify designated people and entities before a filing is submitted to the Commission**. Advance submission requirements vary depending on the type of case. For instance, in Section 248 siting cases, the advance submission provides basic information on the proposed project so that the recipients can contact the applicant directly to try to resolve any issues or concerns they have about the project **before an application is filed.**”

An advance submission matter is not a case in front of the Commission for decision. After the advance submission period for the type of case, a petition can then be filed with the Commission for the project. Once a petition case is filed, the matter will have a case number that ends with “-PET”, and that matter will be under Commission review.

The notice you are referring to was mailed to the Commission and, as it was found to be referring to an advance submission matter, was uploaded into the advance submission matter as a public comment. The event the document refers to is **not** an event that was set by the Commission, noticed by the Commission, nor involves the Commission in any way. It apparently was a notice issued by the Town of Manchester. I would recommend reaching out to the Town or the proposed applicant for the advance submission matter.
