PETITION

By this Petition, T-Mobile Northeast, LLC (“T-Mobile” or “Petitioner”), acting by and through its agent J. Lee Associates (“J. Lee”), represents as follows:

1. Petitioner respectfully requests that this filing be treated by the Public Utility Commission clerk as an application for and/or notice of intent of a de minimis pursuant to 30 V.S.A. §248a(a) and (k).
2. T-Mobile holds a Certificate of Public Good to provide commercial mobile radio services within the geographic borders of the State of Vermont pursuant to licenses granted by the Federal Communications Commission.
3. T-Mobile is seeking to improve its wireless network and has entered into an agreement with J. Lee, whereby J. Lee will obtain the necessary governmental permits and approvals for modifications to T-Mobile’s existing telecommunications antennas and equipment at the Facility.
4. By this Petition submitted to the PUC via §I(a) of the ePUC Procedures for Electronic Filing (“ePUC Pr.”) Petitioner proposes to modify telecommunications antennas and equipment at an existing Facility located at 54 Woods Hill Road, Swanton, VT.
5. The certification of compliance, affidavit and exhibits included with this Petition demonstrate that the proposed Project qualifies as a de minimis modification under 30 V.S.A. §248a(b)(2) and the PUC’s Procedures Order, thereby allowing the PUC to issue a Certificate of Public Good in accordance with the procedures established by 30 V.S.A. 248a(k).
6. This proceeding is subject to the general authority and limitations of the Telecommunications Act of 1996, 47 U.S.C. § 332 (c)(7)(A), as it involves a decision by the State of Vermont regarding the placement, construction and modification of a personal wireless service facility. Because the Project also qualifies as an eligible facility request under the federal Spectrum Act, 47 U.S.C. §1455(a)(I), it is subject to a 60-day timeframe for review of the application pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 1.40001(c). T-Mobile hereby preserves its rights under the

Telecommunications Act and the Spectrum Act to the extent necessary to proceed with the Project.

Petitioner accordingly requests that the PUC issue a Certificate of Public Good for the Project in accordance with the procedures established by 30 V.S.A. 248a(k).

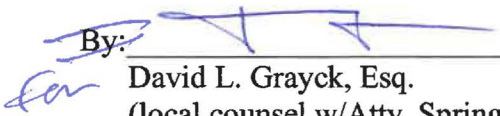
