ORDER LIFTING STAY AND REQUESTING SCHEDULE PROPOSALS

This case concerns a petition filed by Vermont Renewable Gas, LLC (“VRG”) requesting a certificate of public good (“CPG”), under 30 V.S.A. § 248(j), to construct and operate a 2.2 MW generation facility in Lyndon, Vermont (the proposed “Facility”). In a November 7, 2024, order, the Vermont Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) determined that the public interest will be best served by using the full procedures of 30 V.S.A. § 248 to review the petition for a CPG.

In the November 7, 2024, order, the Commission also stayed this proceeding until the standard-offer contract investigation is completed in Case No. 24-3359-INV. With the issuance of final decision in that case, the stay in this proceeding is lifted.

Parties are requested to file proposed schedules for this proceeding. The deadline for proposed schedules is Wednesday, October 15, 2025.

Because the Facility is a renewable energy plant that is 2.2 MW, certain Section 248 criteria are conditionally waived. The conditional waivers include 30 V.S.A. § 248(b)(4) (economic benefit to the State) for plants under the Standard Offer Program. Because the Facility no longer holds a standard-offer contract, there is no conditional waiver for Section 248(b)(4).

In the filings for proposed scheduled, parties should address whether supplemental testimony is needed to address the Section 248(b)(4) criterion.


