Tariff filing of Green Mountain Power Corporation for a proposed Zone 4 Energy Storage tariff to be effective with bills rendered on or after May 30, 2025	
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Order entered: 10/10/2025

ORDER CLOSING CASE

On April 15, 2025, Green Mountain Power Corporation (“GMP”) filed a proposed Zone 4 Energy Storage Program Service tariff (“Zone 4 Tariff”) with the Vermont Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) to be effective with bills rendered on or after May 30, 2025. GMP proposed to offer energy system storage installations for lease at no cost to certain residential customers taking service from GMP’s EJ-G7 (Brattleboro), 56G1 (Wilmington), CH-G11 (Chester), and DM-G6 (Dummerston) circuits.

On May 29, 2025, the Commission issued an order opening this investigation.

On August 11, 2025, the Vermont Department of Public Service (“Department”) filed testimony recommending that the Commission deny approval of the Zone 4 Tariff.¹

On August 18, 2025, GMP made a filing stating that “GMP is ready to move forward with the scheduled [evidentiary] hearing in this matter on September 16, 2025, without further filings.”

On September 12, 2025, GMP filed a motion to postpone the evidentiary hearing scheduled for September 16, 2025. GMP represented that the Department did not oppose this request. The Commission cancelled the evidentiary hearing.

On September 24, 2025, GMP filed a motion requesting to withdraw the tariff filing and close the case. GMP states that after further review of the filings in this case, it “anticipates conducting additional analysis and consultation, including with the Department, regarding implementation of storage programs in Zone 4 and therefore is withdrawing the present proposal to provide an opportunity for that evaluation.” GMP represents that the Department, the only other party to this case, supports the motion to withdraw.

A petition, application, or registration filed with the Commission may be withdrawn without order of the Commission by: (1) a petitioner filing a notice of dismissal before any adverse party has filed substantive comments; or (2) the filing of a stipulation of dismissal signed by all parties who have appeared in the action.² In all other cases, no action will be dismissed except by order of the Commission on such terms and conditions as the Commission deems proper.³ Finally, unless otherwise specified in a voluntary notice of dismissal, a stipulation, or a Commission order, a dismissal under Commission Rule 2.220 is without prejudice.⁴

In its motion, GMP states that it is authorized to state that the Department, the only other party to this case, supports the motion to withdraw. Given GMP's representation as well as the Department's testimony recommending that the Commission deny approval of the tariff filing, the Commission deems it proper to grant GMP's motion to withdraw under Rule 2.220. Therefore, we dismiss GMP's tariff filing without prejudice and close this case.






