SCHEDULING CONFERENCE ORDER

This case involves a petition filed by Williston H Solar, LLC (the “Petitioner”) on November 6, 2025, for a certificate of public good (“CPG”) under 30 V.S.A. § 248, with the Vermont Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) for a solar electric generation facility in Williston, Vermont (the proposed “Facility”).

On January 29, 2025, I held a scheduling conference in this matter. Appearances were entered on behalf of the Petitioner; the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources; the Vermont Department of Public Service; and the Vermont Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets.

During the scheduling conference, the parties discussed a jointly proposed procedural schedule submitted by the Petitioner. Based upon the discussion, I adopt the proposed schedule below:

February 9, 2026	Deadline for motions to intervene and requests for public hearing and site visit
February 18, 2026	Deadline for first round of Discovery to be served on Petitioner
March 4, 2026	Petitioner’s responses to First Round of Discovery due
March 27, 2026	Deadline for filing MOUs, Comments, or non-adversarial Non-Petitioner Testimony
April 3, 2026	Deadline for Petitioner’s Response Testimony (Petitioner’s testimony to respond to potential non-adversarial non-Petitioner testimony)

April 8, 2026	If contested issues remain, deadline for requests for evidentiary hearing, and proposed schedules for litigation, including Non-Petitioner testimony and Petitioner discovery on Non-Petitioners
April 13, 2026	If no hearing is requested, the Petitioner shall submit a proposal for decision

If motions for summary judgment are filed in this case, then, consistent with Commission Rule 2.219(B) and unless different deadlines are established by the Commission, (1) responses are due 30 days after the motion is filed; and (2) replies to any responses are due 14 days after the responses are filed. If motions to dismiss are filed in this case, then, consistent with Commission Rule 2.206(E), (1) responses are due 30 days after the motion is filed; and (2) replies to any responses are due 14 days after the responses are filed.¹ For any other motions, then, consistent with Commission Rule 2.206(E) and unless different deadlines are established by the Commission, (1) responses are due 14 days after the motion is filed; and (2) replies to any responses are due 14 days after the responses are filed. Consistent with Commission Rule 2.206(F), surreplies may only be filed with permission from the Commission.

Parties are reminded that documents submitted in pdf format should be in an “unlocked” format, i.e., searchable and extractable, rather than in an image format.

Members of the public interested in this proceeding may participate by submitting public comments or by intervening as a formal party to the case. Members of the public may also simply monitor the Commission’s actions in a specific case. ¹ Commission Rule 2.206(E) provides the Commission with discretion to set response and reply deadlines that differ from the 14 days normally provided by that rule.

Pursuant to 30 V.S.A. §§ 20 and 21, the Petitioner will be responsible for court reporter costs incurred by the Commission during the course of this proceeding and billed back to the Petitioner.
