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**MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF SCHEDULE**

Rising Tide Towers II, LLC (“RTT”), together with Wireless Partners FN, LLC (“WP”, and together with RTT, “Rising Tide” or “Petitioner”), by and through its attorneys at Downs Rachlin Martin PLLC, respectfully seeks that the Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) extend the schedule established by its most recent Order dated December 31, 2025, as follows (extensions are shown in red, and new deadlines are shown in bold):

Petitioner solicited and received consent from counsel for Tanya and Jesse Hart (the “Intervenors”) in seeking this extension of time. The Department of Public Service (the “Department”) has also consented to the proposed extension.

All parties have agreed to forego the evidentiary hearing originally scheduled for the week of March 30, 2026. Additionally, although the parties intend to file the transcripts of all of the depositions taken in this matter on or before April 15, 2026, if, for whatever reason, the transcript of the deposition of the Department’s aesthetics expert is not available by April 15, 2026, the parties will confer in good faith as to whether additional time is needed to file primary and reply briefs.

The purpose of this request is to provide Petitioner with the opportunity to respond to any recommendations provided by the Department’s aesthetics expert and to provide Petitioner and Intervenors with the opportunity to depose the Department’s aesthetics expert.
