In the towns/villages of Bakersfield, Enosburg and Fairfield there are approximately 5803 residents who are served by 137 emergency personnel covering about 1618 square miles. Most of the emergency personnel in these towns are volunteers. Multiple "dead spots" of cellular coverage have been identified by statements from these personnel, who are all but begging for approval of the cell tower proposed on Bordoville road to help assist them in the ability to perform their jobs safely, effectively and efficiently.

While recognizing the importance of views and historical significance, I feel that denying this application for those secondary reasons would be an affront to the dedicated people who want to provide appropriate care and safety for the residents and themselves in this area.

Furthermore, Enosburgh and surrounding communities have greatly suffered from lack of police force for an extended period of time. Addressing the holes in communication would assist in the Towns ability to entice law enforcement consideration for this area.
