**SCHEDULING CONFERENCE ORDER**

This case involves a petition filed by Airport RD1 VT Solar, LLC (“Airport Solar”) requesting a certificate of public good (“CPG”) under 30 V.S.A. § 248, authorizing the construction and operation of a 4.975 MW solar facility off Airport Road in Fair Haven, Vermont (the proposed “Facility”).

On May 1, 2026, I held a scheduling conference. Appearances were entered by representatives of Airport Solar, the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources, the Vermont Department of Public Service, and the Vermont Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets.

I adopt the following schedule that was discussed at the scheduling conference.<sup>1</sup>

<sup>2</sup> Airport Solar agrees to accept discovery from parties where motions to intervene are pending. If any such discovery is served and the corresponding motion is granted, then the Airport Solar will respond to that discovery. If such a motion is denied, then the Airport Solar would not respond to that discovery.

Members of the public interested in this proceeding may participate by submitting public comments or by intervening as a formal party to the case. Members of the public may also participate by monitoring the case in the Vermont Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) case management system, ePUC. Pursuant to 30 V.S.A. §§ 20 and 21, Airport Solar will be responsible for court reporter costs incurred by the Commission during this proceeding and billed back to Airport Solar. Unless Airport Solar informs the Commission otherwise, the Commission will mail the invoice for these costs to the attorney of record or the official representative for Airport Solar.
