ORDER ESTABLISHING SCHEDULE

This case involves a petition filed by Green Mountain Power Corporation (“GMP”) for a certificate of public good (“CPG”) under 30 V.S.A. § 248, authorizing the rebuild of the Georgia substation in Georgia, Vermont.

On April 30, 2026, I held a scheduling conference in this matter. Appearances were entered by Debra Bouffard, Esq., Sheehey Furlong & Behm, on behalf of GMP; Matthew Bakerpoole, Vermont Department of Public Service; and Donald J. Einhorn, Esq., Vermont Agency of Natural Resources. In addition, the scheduling conference was attended by Kamran Hassan of GMP and Douglas Bergstrom and Todd Cadieux from the Town of Georgia.

At the scheduling conference, the parties discussed GMP's proposed schedule. I adopt the schedule as proposed by the parties:

May 15, 2026	Deadline for motions to intervene and deadline for requesting public hearing and/or site visit
May 20, 2026	Deadline for round one discovery on GMP by parties
May 28, 2026	Deadline for responses to motions to intervene
June 3, 2026	Deadline for GMP responses to round one discovery by parties
June 10, 2026	Deadline for round one discovery on GMP by intervenors, if any
June 24, 2026	Deadline for GMP to respond to round one discovery by intervenors, if any
July 1, 2026	Deadline for round two discovery on GMP

July 15, 2026	Deadline for GMP to respond to round two discovery
If stipulation or settlement:	
August 12, 2026	Deadline for parties to file stipulations and any requests for a hearing
August 27, 2026	Tentative evidentiary hearing if requested, or deadline for proposed findings if no hearing is requested
September 11, 2026	Proposed findings deadline if evidentiary hearing is requested
If no stipulation or settlement:	
August 14, 2026	Deadline for submitting proposed schedules for litigation of any contested issues


Parties are reminded that documents submitted in pdf format should be in an “unlocked” format, i.e., searchable and extractable, rather than in an image format.

Members of the public interested in this proceeding may participate by submitting public comments or by intervening as a formal party to the case. Members of the public may also simply monitor the Vermont Public Utility Commission’s (“Commission”) actions in a specific case. 
