EXPEDITED MOTION TO CHANGE SCHEDULE

The Vermont Department of Public Service (“Department”) files this Motion to Change Schedule (“Motion”) to respectfully request that the Vermont Public Utility Commission extend the July 24, 2026, deadline to respond to the Commission’s July 6, 2026, Order Requesting Comments on Staff Recommendations to August 14, 2026. The Department requests additional time to respond based on a lack of staff availability due to overlapping case deadlines, travel for regulatory conferences, and vacation schedules for Department staff working on this and other concurrent cases. The Department requested the consent of the parties to this case and received consent from the Vermont Electric Power Supply Authority (“VPPSA”),¹ the City of Burlington Electric Department, the Village of Ludlow Electric Department, the Village of Jacksonville Electric Company, Vermont Electric Cooperative, Efficiency Vermont, Green Mountain Power Corp., GF Power LLC, and the Vermont Electric Power Company, Inc.

¹ VPPSA’s counsel indicated that the Department may treat consent from VPPSA as being inclusive of consent from VPPSA member utilities with the exclusion of VPPSA’s strategic members, the City of Burlington Electric Department (“BED”), the Town of Stowe Electric Department (“Stowe”), and the Village of Hyde Park Electric Department (“Hyde Park”). At the time of this filing the Department had not heard from Stowe or Hyde Park.
