ORDER ESTABLISHING HEARING SCHEDULE

This case concerns a petition filed by Vermont Renewable Gas, LLC (“VRG”) requesting a certificate of public good, under 30 V.S.A. § 248, to construct and operate a 2.2 MW generation facility in Lyndon, Vermont.

A remote evidentiary hearing in this case is scheduled for **Monday, August 24, 2026, at 9:30 A.M.** Information on how to access the remote hearing can be found in the notice of hearing issued in this case by the Clerk of the Vermont Public Utility Commission (“Commission”).

On August 18, 2026, VRG and the intervenors — Ernest and Madeline Hastings and Steven Dolgin (“Intervenors”) — submitted separate proposed schedules for witnesses and limits on the amount of time for cross-examination. VRG and the intervenors did not agree on the duration of testimony for two witnesses. VRG represents that the Vermont Agency of Agriculture, Food and Markets, the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources, and Conservation Law Foundation (“CLF”) had no objections to its proposed schedule and state that the Town of Lyndon Electric Department, John Ling, Town of Lyndon, and Town of St. Johnsbury did not respond.

On August 18, 2026, the Vermont Department of Public Service (“Department”) made a filing stating that it does not intend to cross-examine any witnesses and is agreeable to any witness order the Commission deems appropriate.

I am adopting the schedule proposed by the Intervenors, with modifications to include time for breaks, lunch, and cross-examination proposed by CLF. The Intervenors contend that there is a good faith basis to request two hours each for witness Dell’Olio and witness Skorokhodov as there are multiple lines of inquiry that are within the Intervenors’ bases for

having standing in this matter. The Intervenors state that they will make every effort to complete cross-examination of the witnesses in an expeditious fashion to conserve the resources of the Commission and the other parties.

Accordingly, the schedule for witnesses and limits on the amount of time for cross-examination is provided below. The schedule times are approximate, recognizing that cross-examination may be shorter than limit, there may be witness redirect examination, or the need to resolve procedural or technical issues.
