Green Mountain Power Corporation's initial filing for Resilient Home innovative pilot

ORDER DETERMINING NO FURTHER ACTION

On April 29, 2019, Green Mountain Power Corporation (“GMP”) provided notice of a proposed Resilient Home Innovative Pilot (the “Pilot”) pursuant to its alternative regulation plan approved by the Vermont Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) in Case No. 17-3232-PET.¹

On May 14, 2019, the Department of Public Service (“Department”) filed comments on the Pilot. The Department recommended that the Commission suspend and investigate the Pilot. In the alternative, the Department recommended that the Commission impose requirements on the Pilot.

GMP filed its reply to the Department on May 15, 2019. GMP stated that it “is working collaboratively with the Department to tackle many of the new questions outlined in their comments, and we remain ready to address the remaining issues discussed in their comments, by amendment to the Pilot.”² GMP committed to limit the scope of the Pilot to 500 participants, with no more than 250 participants acquiring a Tesla Powerwall system directly from GMP. GMP also committed to file a Tesla Powerwall tariff within 60 days.

On May 21, 2019, the Department filed its response to GMP’s reply comments. The Department withdrew its request that the Commission suspend and investigate the Pilot because the Department was satisfied that GMP had sufficiently addressed the issues that, according to the Department, had the largest potential for adverse ratepayer impact. Subject to the commitments described in GMP’s May 15 reply, the Department stated that it would be appropriate for the Commission to allow GMP to proceed with the Pilot without investigation.




¹ Public comments on the Pilot were filed by Renewable Energy Vermont (“REV”) on May 8, 2019. GMP filed its reply to REV later that day.

Based on the Department's withdrawal of its request to suspend and investigate, the Commission will take no further action at this time with respect to the Pilot.


