This letter provides the Public Utility Commission (the “Commission”) regarding Green Mountain Power’s (“GMP”) plans to submit a battery tariff filing to the Commission<sup>1</sup>.

GMP’s efforts to develop a solid, well thought out tariff that provides the most value for our customers, involves collaboration and consultation with vendors, employees, consultants, contractors, and valued stakeholders, including the Department of Public Service (“DPS”) and Renewable Energy Vermont (“REV”). While our tariff framework has been completed, there are aspects of the tariff that remain under development. One example involves GMP’s commitment to provide opportunity for third party vendors to participate in the tariff offering. This is a tariff component that we are confident we can accommodate, however, we want to ensure that this is accomplished in the simplest way possible, and in a way that fits in well, and can be administered efficiently, and in alignment with our other offerings. We expect that we will share a draft tariff with the DPS and REV in the next week, and that a filing with the Commission will follow.
