Dear Ms. Anderson:

Green Mountain Power (“GMP”) has reviewed the Joint Motion to Amend Schedule (“Joint Motion”) filed by the Agency of Natural Resources (“ANR”) and the Department of Public Service (“DPS”) on October 12, 2021 in the above-referenced proceedings. GMP understands the parties’ need for extension of the deadlines in these proceedings, given the circumstances outlined in the Joint Motion, and supports providing the time necessary to consider the important issues raised in these cases, provided that the impact of delay on GMP’s customers can be addressed and limited in these cases and in related proceedings, including the upcoming rate and regulation plan proceedings which involve significant analytical work that is, in part, dependent upon the outcome here. We expect other parties would share those goals and concerns. We will be working on how to extend the current term contract to maintain the status quo as the Commission considers the issues raised in the present proceedings, and protect GMP’s customers, while not impacting the evidence and analysis here.

With these concerns in mind, GMP does not oppose the requested extension but also would find a separate, shorter extension for the briefing deadlines appropriate as suggested by the Conservation Law Foundation and AllEarth Renewables, Inc.
