**GLOBALFOUNDRIES U.S. 2 LLC’S RESPONSE
TO JOINT MOTION TO AMEND SCHEDULE**

Petitioner GLOBALFOUNDRIES U.S. 2 LLC (“GLOBALFOUNDRIES”), by and through counsel, submits this response to the joint motion filed by the Vermont Department of Public Service (“DPS”) and the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources (“ANR”) to amend the schedule in these cases.

DPS and ANR have requested that the existing schedule be extended by approximately four weeks to allow a more thorough evaluation of the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Plan under discussion with GLOBALFOUNDRIES. GLOBALFOUNDRIES concurs in the request. The parties are exploring a novel approach to advancing the State’s policy and regulatory goals, and it is not surprising that additional time is needed for all parties to fully evaluate the proposed framework. As DPS and ANR noted in their motion, one component of the proposed plan has been the investment of \$10 million to reduce greenhouse gas emissions associated with manufacturing processes—specifically, investing in the installation of 28 abatement devices on chemical vapor deposition tools throughout the Essex facility. While GLOBALFOUNDRIES recently revised its estimates of the greenhouse gas reductions that would be achieved by this specific project, the abatement devices are still projected to meet the State’s 2025 goal of 26%

reduction of greenhouse gas emissions from the 2005 baseline, and GLOBALFOUNDRIES' commitment to meeting that goal has not changed. GLOBALFOUNDRIES' environmental personnel have been working closely and transparently with their counterparts at ANR on the reduction figures. Pending these new projections, and given the complexity of the undertaking to establish a new planning framework, more time is appropriate to allow the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Plan discussions to conclude and to thereafter permit the other parties discovery on any Memorandum of Understanding that may be reached.
