Below are comments in response to the draft of regulations and should be expectations of the citizen/taxpayers:

- 1. Determine and Establish the measurement of success in terms of reduction in carbon dioxide levels in the local and national atmosphere. How much and timing.
- 2. Determine and Establish the measurement of success in reductions to local and national temperature observations. What degree of reduction and by what date?
- 3. Provide the detailed cost savings and basis for the "cost neutral" Clean Heat Standard. We are told there will be no cost to Vermont citizens and large savings as a result of the CHS. This needs to be agreed to in advance of regulation release. Again, as a measure of success. If we don't have hard targets we can not proceed to spend the taxpayer and rate payer's money.
- 4. Establish the amount of the Clean Heat Fee that must be paid by on a per-gallon or per BTU basis and when.
